We would like to remind homeowners that we are still in the middle of hurricane season. Please make sure all loose items around your homes are tied down and/or securely stored away. Please make sure your



trees or palms are trimmed to avoid any damages to your home or a neighbor's property. Below are some helpful hints to help you prepare for a storm. Everyone have a wonderful and safe Labor Day weekend!

Emergency Preparedness Items

- Prepare a car kit to include a flash light, jumper cables, tool kit, etc.
- Make sure to have NOAA Weather Radio.
- Make sure to have an extra fire extinguisher.
- Make sure to have an inventory of all personal and household items.
- Cell Phone Emergency Contact: Save ICE on your cell phone under contacts with your emergency contact information just in case.
- Make sure to have enough bottled water and canned goods stored away in your pantry.

Home Landscaping

It has recently been observed that some residents have removed substantial portions of the original landscape design without approval from the Association's Architectural Review Committee. Please know that this landscaping must be replaced under the original design or an ARC application submitted to the committee. The Board has recently directed that a review of the community be conducted to identify specific addresses with notices sent. Below are sections from the ARC Guidelines that speak to this issue. If you do not have a complete copy of the guidelines, please contact HOA Office at hoaparkviewpointe@gmail.com or 404-239-3404 Parkview HOA office.

-All ARC applications for changes to lawn and landscaping areas must include a plot plan showing the proposed and existing location(s) and mature sizes of the plant, tree or other landscaping material. The plot plan must show accurate spacing between all new or moved items in relation to all other objects to show a 6 ft. clear path for lawn service equipment.

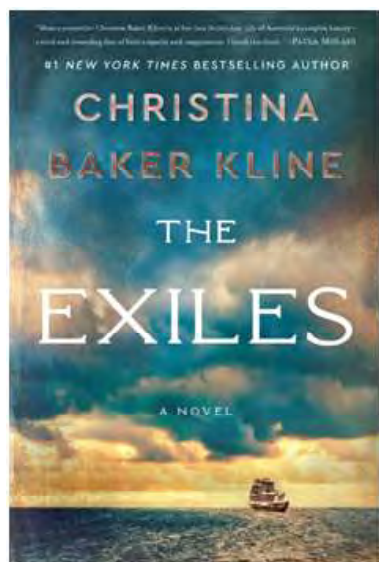

THE SMART WAY TO CARE FOR DENIM

Ditch the appliances, your washer and dryer are killing your denim. Jeans were originally designed to withstand the rigors of the blue-collar workday, but in today's society, they're also high fashion. That means you need to treat your Levi's like Versace if you want them to deep on looking their best. And the best way to do this is to keep your denim out of the washer and dryer. While efficient, these devices will eventually ruin your costly clothes. If you've invested in some premium denim, follow these four

tips to get the most out of your beloved bottoms.

Soak your denim in vinegar

Whether you paid chump change for a pair of black jeans or spent half your paycheck on indigo-dyed selvedge denim, the goal is to keep the original color. Water itself will wash away your denim's dye over time, and soap will only hasten the process.

Try soaking your jeans in cold water and vinegar instead of washing them. Yes, vinegar. Add one cup of distilled white vinegar to a cold water bath and soak your jeans for about an hour. Hang or lay flat to dry, and don't worry about smelling like vinegar—the odor goes away after your pants dry. This technique locks in the dye's color, keeping your deans dark and your furniture clean.

And if you *must* use a washing machine, toss in a cup of vinegar on a hand-wash setting, but please, no detergent.

Give your trousers a light steam shower

Water, both warm and hot; not only fades your denim—it will cause shrinkage. If you're barely able to squirm into your skinny jeans, a hot bath is the last thing they need. Even if you don't use a dryer, hot water will cause fabric to expand and then shrink.

Unless you've been playing in mud, your jeans probably aren't very dirty. A quick way to freshen them up is to hang them in your bathroom while you shower. Steam from your aromatic shower will soon have your dark

Out and About In Our Community

Greetings Friends and Neighbors,
This month, yours truly, planned to write a great article on the new Brightline rail service from Orlando to Miami and vice versa. Well, "Shiver me Timbers", several of the websites that were perused by myself had conflicting and erroneous information.

Now onto what was able to be deciphered. Today, Brightline trains share tracks with freight trains from Miami to West Palm Beach. The company is paying for track upgrades on the shared use line from West Palm Beach north to Cocoa. Those improvements, costing an estimated \$4 billion dollars, will allow Brightline to run up to 110 mph from West Palm Beach to Cocoa starting in 2022.

Brightline trains will seamlessly exit the freight line at Cocoa and head west on the new dedicated tracks to Orlando International Airport, Terminal C. Terminal C is supposed to open to the public, this month, September 2022.

Future service will extend from Orlando International Airport to Tampa on dedicated tracks in the median of I-4, which was widened in the late 2000's to accommodate high speed trains. This planned extension allegedly will have stops at Walt Disney World and in Lakeland, as well as a link to Orlando's SunRail commuter train. The definitive location of the link to Orlando's SunRail commuter train has not been released, and perhaps remains undetermined as of this writing.

Every Brightline train includes spacious restrooms that feature a touch free experience. (Their words, not mine!)

There is complimentary high speed Wi-Fi offered on all Brightline trains and power outlets / USB ports are available at the seats. Brightline trains are pet friendly for dogs and cats, with restrictions. Pets must be leashed, or crated at all times while on the train, or within the station.

Smart passengers may purchase snacks and non alcoholic beverages aboard the train. For Premium paying passengers, snacks and non alcoholic beverages are included. Having travel options using rail to visit some portions of our paradise state is a dream come true. There will be challenges and problems as with any new undertaking. That's OK. We have extremely intelligent, dedicated, committed personnel dedicated to their fields of expertise to fix any problem that may arise.

We live in a fantastic state surrounded with beauty, wildlife and opportunity,

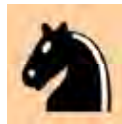

SEPTEMBER HOLIDAYS

Baby Safety Month. Keeping your baby safe is your No. 1 priority as a parent or caregiver. Whether you're expecting your first baby, adding to your family, or enjoying being a grandparent, now is the ideal time to take some simple steps to keep your baby healthy and safe.

Hunger Action Month. For tens of millions of people in America, a daily meal isn't a choice between different dishes. It's a choice between food and other crucial needs—like medicine, electricity, or child care. This September, join Feeding America for Hunger Action Month by choosing to stand against hunger.

Ovarian Cancer Awareness Month. Ovarian cancer is a leading cause of cancer-related death in American women, largely because early ovarian cancer often has no symptoms. Age and a family history of the disease are the strongest risk factors. Screening for ovarian cancer is difficult, but pelvic imaging and blood tests are currently the best tests for diagnosing ovarian cancer.

FEWER PEOPLE PLAN TO HAVE BABIES

The U.S. birthrate has been declining for the last six years, and that's not likely to change soon, according to The Washington Post. A 2021 survey of adult men and women who were not currently parents asked how likely they were to have children in the future; just 26% said "very likely," a decrease from 2018, when the number was 32%. Those answering "not too likely" had risen from 16% in 2018 to 21% in 2021.

Why? Fifty-six percent replied that they just don't want kids. Forty-three percent cited medical reasons, economic or financial issues, or lack of a partner. It's all part of a general trend: The 2020 census found that during the previous decade the U.S. population grew at the second slowest rate of any decade since the founding of the U.S.

TATTOOS NO LONGER MEAN 'UNPROFESSIONAL'

More than 40% of millennials have tattoos, compared to just 13% of baby boomers. That's from the Mint Lounge website, which notes that tattoos have become more acceptable in the workplace in recent years.

A study by LinkedIn notes that around 60% of 2,000 working Americans say that the meaning of "professional" has changed since the start of the COVID-19 pandemic—and just 40% think that covering body art to project a more professional appearance is required these days.

Research conducted by LinkedIn and others finds that tattoos don't appear to have much negative (or positive) impact on client relationships at traditional white-collar firms. On the retail front, according to the Journal of Organizational Behavior, customers don't purchase less from employees with tattoos, and in creative businesses, tattooed employees may actually provide a competitive edge.

PREVENT INJURIES AS YOUR BODY AGES

As our bodies grow older, the risk of musculoskeletal injuries increases. Falls are frequently the cause, especially for people over 55. The NextAvenue website offers these tips for preventing injuries as you inevitably age:

- Check with your doctor. Before you start on any exercise program, or if you're just concerned about potential injuries, talk to your primary care doctor, an orthopedist, or a physical therapist. They'll help you decide what kind of physical activity is safe. This is especially important if you're feeling pain anywhere.

- Practice aerobic exercise. Aerobic exercises like swimming, brisk walking, jogging, and bicycling improve heart health, blood flow and lung capacity. They also help your body release endorphins, which can improve your mood and general sense of well-being.

- Manage your weight. Extra weight is a strain on your heart, knees, hips, and even your fingers. Watch your diet and work with a nutritionist to develop healthy eating habits.

- Avoid falls. Remove tripping hazards like loose rugs. Don't let clutter build up on your floors. Install night lights in hallways and bathrooms so you can walk around safely at night. Wear shoes that support your feet. Always watch where you're walking, both at home and outside.

- Check your medications. Some medicines, including over-the-counter drugs, can make you dizzy or drowsy, increasing the risk of losing your balance and falling. Pay attention to their effect on your body, and talk to your doctor to find out what's safe.

Freeze your jeans

Got an impromptu date and need to quickly freshen up your luscious raw denim? Stick your pants in the freezer for a few hours to temporarily eliminate odors. Raw or "dry" denim is denim that hasn't been washed after dye is applied. The appeal of these jeans is their unique way their aesthetic develops over time. The rule of thumb for raw denim is to not wash them for six months. Washing will fade the dye too quickly; wearing them for an extended period of time will naturally fade certain areas and distress others. In other words, given enough time, raw denim becomes totally you.

Since water is the last thing you want to touch these types of jeans, you can freeze them for a quick refresh. Freezing kills some bacteria, and bacteria are the prime cause of unpleasant odors. This isn't a sure-fire fix; though-plenty of other bacteria must be heated if you want them to go away.

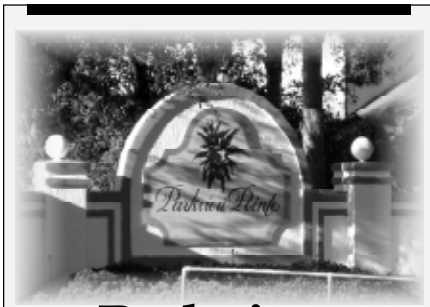
