At the January meeting the board reviewed our amended community standards which will be made available to all homeowners before the February meeting. At that time, these amended standards will be considered for official board approval.

The board also approved the purchase of new exercise equipment for our recreation room. This purchase will replace the existing equipment that is not commercial grade as well as add some different pieces of exercise equipment. The new equipment will include a rowing machine, a recumbent bike and upright bike, Bowflex dumbbells and bench, and 2 new treadmills. The number of people using the recreation room has increased after our recent renovations to the gym and game room. I hope that these changes and the new equipment will encourage more of you to enjoy this facility.

This is a good time to take care of projects around your home. As always please complete an ARC form BEFORE you start any projects to the exterior of your home and property. This includes painting your home or driveway, new roof, new windows, the planting or removal of trees and shrubs. The ARC forms are included in the newsletter, online, and at the clubhouse. If you're not sure please check with Nicole.

This will certainly help avoid problems later.

A reminder to everyone that the **pool and spa** hours are from dawn to dusk and the clubhouse is open from **6:00am until 10:00pm**. It's also important to remember that the clubhouse alarm automatically sets at **10:00pm!**

With the new year comes a new list of maintenance projects to help the community's facilities in the best condition.

Now that spring is approaching, it will soon be time to start a good lawn care program. Although the association provides lawn mowing, it is the homeowner's responsibility to maintain trees, shrubs, and beds. Please be sure to keep our shrubs and trees trimmed, remove dead palm fronds, and keep the beds free of weeds. We also stress the importance of having your irrigation system inspected regularly. Sand can clog the heads and springs can become worn out preventing them


from closing properly, which in time may cause them to be broken off by mowers.

10 COMMONSENSE WAYS TO COMMUNICATE BETTER

1. Listen

I mean really listen. Don't let your mind wander, concentrate on what the person is saying. Of our five senses - taste, touch, hearing, smell, and sight - we only learn 11% through hearing, and then we remember very little of what we hear.

2. If You Wonder Whether Or Not To Say Something - Don't

We've all done this. When you should be listening, you're having an internal debate within your head..."should I say this?...maybe not." If you debate it, don't do it.

3. If You Don't Understand, Ask!

Have you ever agreed with someone, maybe even nodded your head in agreement but really had no idea what the person was talking about? Don't be afraid to ask the speaker to clarify, you can learn some amazing things.

4. Speak The Language Of The Listener

We all have different listeners with varied backgrounds and educations. Talk in terms that they can understand and relate to the best.

5. Be Sensitive To The Response Of The Listener

Watch folks as you talk to them. Do they understand what you're saying, or are they just agreeing with you? Are they really listening or are they thinking about

what they want to say when you stop talking?

6. Change Your Tone And Tempo

Actors are great at this. Vary your voice, tone, and pitch. Sometimes talk fast, then slow. The pause is most effective. And if you really want folks to listen, just whisper.

7. Dress For Success

Think about your audience and your message, and then choose your attire properly. Your attire will help you deliver your message in a professional manner.

8. Be Brief And Keep It Simple

There is no reason to say "I lament my prorogation" when you can say, "I'm sorry I'm late." The Ten Commandments are pretty succinct. The Gettysburg Address has only 264 words in it. Brief and simple works.


9. Answer "What's In It For Me?"

This is what everyone is subconsciously asking. Tell your audience what you have that will benefit them.

10. Make The Other Person Feel Important
