To our valued customers in Parkview Pointe,

We want to thank you again for your continued business and for allowing Weber Environmental Services, Inc. to provide our landscape maintenance services for your community.

These past few months have seen more than average rainfall totals in the Central Florida area. From August 1, 2020 through September 16, 2020, the Orlando International Airport has reported rainfall totals of 13.7 inches. The excessive rainfall has been challenging for the mow crew as many areas of the subdivision do not dry out very quickly and remain wet when we attempt to mow them, especially some of the back yard areas and side yard areas between homes. Some of these areas must be left un-mowed until the ground is dry enough to allow us to mow because the machines make unsightly ruts and cause damage to the turf when we attempt to mow when the ground is too wet. Some of these areas can also be too wet for the crew members to walk through with hand held equipment as well. The excessive rainfall also makes it difficult while crew members are blowing off the wet clippings, as the wet clippings tend to stick to hard surfaces until dry, such as driveways, sidewalks, and roadways.


As the weather temperatures begin to fall, Weber will begin putting out granular fertilizer throughout the community onto the turf and we will begin to spray for broad leaf weeds in the turf. Broadleaf weeds have really grown this year with all of the excessive rainfall. Weber does not treat for evasive grasses such as Crabgrass or Bermuda Grass. Please see, call, or email Nicole at the clubhouse office if you wish to be added or taken off of our horticulture skip list.

Again, we at Weber thank you for your continued business as we strive to keep the community well maintained through these challenging times.

BOOK DISCUSSION GROUP



HERE ARE YOUR CHOICES FOR MASKS

Chances are we'll be wearing masks to protect ourselves from the coronavirus for a long time to come. What's the best mask to wear, though? The New York Times runs down your options:

- **N95.** These single-use masks block 95% of small particles (0.3 microns). They're made of polyester and other synthetic fibers which act as a filter. If you have facial hair, however, you won't get a good fit, and they don't fit well on children either.
- **Medical masks.** These are what you commonly see in hospitals. Some filter 60-80% of particles under lab conditions. They can protect you from larger droplets and splatter, but their looser fit makes them less effective than the N95.
- **Homemade masks.** Many people are making their own masks from fabric around the house. An effective homemade mask uses material like cotton fabric that's dense enough to catch particles but still breathable. You can also use materials like a heavy cotton T-shirt, flannel, or a dish towel that's tightly woven. Material with a high thread count offers the best protection.
- **Homemade masks with filters.** Sew a pocket in the front of your mask to hold an additional filter. You can use paper towels or coffee filters. Be sure to place a layer of cotton or a similar material on either side of the filter.

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

CICADAS

Several people have been asking about the insects in the trees that make so much noise, especially at night, and they seem to move from tree to tree. They are cicadas. Their name is a direct derivation of the Latin cicada, meaning "buzzer" which is sort of what they sound like.

There are about 2,500 species of cicada around the world, and many remain unclassified. Cicadas live in temperate to tropical climates where they are among the most widely recognized of all insects, mainly due to their large size and remarkable acoustic talents. Cicadas are often colloquially called locusts, although they are unrelated to true locusts, which are a kind of grasshopper.

They are also known as "jar flies" and, regionally as June Bugs or July flies in the Southeastern United States, and as "heat bugs" in Canada and the mid-West. Cicadas are related to leafhoppers and spittlebugs. In parts of the southern Appalachian Mountains in the United States, they are known as "dry flies" because of the dry shell that they leave behind. The females lay their eggs deep in tree branches.

Many people around the world regularly eat cicadas; the female is prized, as it is meatier. Cicadas have been (or are still) eaten in Ancient Greece, China, Malaysia, Burma, Latin America, and the Congo. Shells of cicadas are employed in

the traditional medicines of China. In the Ancient Greek myth, Tithonus eventually turns into a cicada after being granted immortality but not eternal youth by Zeus. Jean de La Fontaine began his collection of fables with the story The Cicada and the Ant based on one of Aesop's fables: in it the cicada spends the summer singing while the ant stores away food, and finds herself without food when the weather turns bitter.

In Japan the cicada is associated with the summer season. The songs

of the cicada are often used in Japanese film and television to indicate that the scene is taking

place in the summer. The song of a particular cicada, called "tsuku-tsuku boshi" is said to indicate the end of summer, and it is called so because of its particular call. During the summer, it is a pastime for children to collect both cicadas and the shells left behind when moulting.

In China the phrase 'to shed off the golden cicada skin' is the poetic name of the tactic of using deception to escape danger, specifically of using decoys (leaving the old shell) to fool enemies. It became one of the 36 classic Chinese stratagems. This is also referred to in Japanese mythical ninja lore, as the technique of "utsusemi" (ie, literally cicada), where ninjas would trick opponents into attacking a decoy.

In Mexico, the mariachi song "La Cigarra" (lit. "The Cicada") romanticizes the insect as a creature that sings until it dies.
